Headline: TechCollect NZ partners with The Warehouse Group to add another six ewaste drop-off sites across New Zealand

TechCollect NZ (TCNZ) is working with New Zealand's leading retailer, The Warehouse Group (TWG), to reduce the amount of e-waste going to landfill. The addition of six new sites expands TCNZ's capacity to fulfill its mission of reducing the environmental impact of e-waste in Aotearoa.

**Auckland, New Zealand, January 2022:** TCNZ have announced the expansion of its national programme network by the addition of six new e-waste drop-off sites. These new sites will be provided via participating Warehouse Stationery stores. Michael Dudley, Senior Policy Manager for TCNZ, comments on the partnership, "Special thanks to our partners at The Warehouse Group for helping us forge the way towards Aotearoa's circular e-waste future. The addition of six Warehouse Stationery stores to our national network mean that Kiwis have even greater access to free recycling options for their unwanted and end-of-life ICT equipment".

The new drop-off sites include:

E-waste is one of the fastest growing waste streams in the world, with the average Kiwi generating more than 21 kilograms of e-waste each year. It is estimated that nearly 100,000 tonnes of e-waste is generated in New Zealand annually.

These additional sites will greatly help in ensuring that more of this e-waste is recycled responsibly and under strict health and safety guidelines. Accepted e-waste items people can drop-off for free include computers, laptops, notebooks, tablets, palmtops, CRT monitors and projectors, LCD, flat panel monitors, printers, scanners, multi-functional devices, cameras, video cameras and computer peripherals, including power supplies and adaptors.



"With The Warehouse Group's support, we will rescue valuable materials from landfill, help to create more jobs in NZ's resource recovery sector, make the Kiwi-economy more resilient and achieve impressive environmental outcomes along the way. We also want to thank our members at Apple, Canon NZ, Dell, HP New Zealand, Microsoft and Toshiba for making this vital initiative possible", says Dudley.

The Warehouse Group Chief Sustainability Officer, David Benattar says the company is proud to further support efforts to build Aotearoa's circular e-waste future with the expansion of the initiative.

"We all have old or unwanted electronic equipment in the cupboard that we don't know what to do with. Kiwis want to recycle but they often don't know where to take their items, especially electronics. The programme expansion to Warehouse Stationary not only improves consumer access to an effective recycling solution for a significant waste stream but will also provide valuable insights to inform an ongoing regulated e-waste product stewardship system in New Zealand."
